

The seed was collected by American Forests from one of the original Yoshino Cherries planted by Mrs.William Howard Taft on 3/29/1912 around

the DC Tidal Basin. Apparently the original 2,000 trees sent in 1909 did not survive so this tree came from a seed collected from the shipment in 1912. "It is a sight to see and makes me think of mom and her love of nature every year when it blooms."

And special thanks to Pam for hosting, working the sale, donations, advertising and everything else needed to make this a success!


