MINUTES - March 11, 2010

The Club met at the home of Carol Ober. Lovely refreshments were enjoyed by all.

A very informative Program on Sheet Mulching and How To Prepare Garden Beds was given by Alexia Sol who works for The Accokeek Foundation at Piscataway Park which includes the National Colonial Farm. One method of Sheet Mulching is to layer bed as follows: Lay down newspapers, water bed, lay down cardboard (overlap), water again, then, add 8" - 12" of mulch - can be hay, straw or leaves. Best done in Fall but can also be done in Spring. Everything will break down.

Meeting was Called to Order by President, Julie Harrison at 8:25 PM. Julie thanked Gilda for our Speaker this evening. There were 19 Members present and one Guest, Carol Ober's daughter Lisa. Each Member responded to the March question "If you were to start seedlings, what would you plant?"


