BYLAWS

Article I

Mount Airy Clay Breakers Garden Club

This Club is known as Mount Airy Clay Breakers

Article II

The purpose of this Club is to enlarge our knowledge, promote interest in better gardens, participate in and promote all activities and projects of the club, and beautify our community.

Article III

Membership

- A. The membership will not exceed more than 20 members at any time.
- B. Any person desiring membership in the Club, providing an opening exists, will be sponsored by a member, attend two meetings as a guest, and on the third meeting be accepted upon agreeing, in the presence of the members, to abide by the bylaws, serve on various committees and participate in Club activities.
- C. When absent for three consecutive meetings, the absentee will notify the President by phone or letter as to her intentions of remaining a member.

Article IV Officers

The officers of the Club will be President, Vice President, Treasurer, Recording Secretary, Corresponding Secretary and Historian.

These officers will be elected annually at the May meeting, and installed at the June meeting for a term not to exceed two (2) consecutive years.

Article V Amendments and Bylaws

Amendments and bylaws must be proposed at a regular meeting and voted upon by two-thirds of the current membership.

Article VI Duties of Officers

- A. The President will be the Chief Executive of the Club, will preside at all meetings and appoint chairmen and special chairmen as occasions arise. The President will be advanced the sum of \$25.00 to spend at her discretion.
- B. The Vice President will, in the absence of the President, exercise the duties of the President.
- C. The Treasurer will have custody of funds, keep full and accurate accounts, and notify members whose dues are not paid by April of each year. The Treasurer will also pay bills submitted with accompanying receipts, and approved at the regular monthly meeting.

- D. The Recording Secretary will keep minutes of all meetings and a current list of members.
- E. The Corresponding Secretary will reply to all pertinent correspondence. She will also be given a supply of stationery and \$10.00 for postage.
- F. The Historian will maintain a history of the Club.

Article VII Meetings

Regular meetings will be held on the second Thursday of each month at 7:30 PM, except July and August, unless otherwise announced. Executive and special meetings shall be held as deemed advisable by the President.

Article VIII Dues

The annual membership dues of \$15.00 are payable at the March meeting. National Area Federation of Garden Clubs, Inc. dues are included. Failure to pay by the June meeting will constitute automatic resignation. Members joining the Club during the period of June through November will pay full dues. New members joining the Club in the last six months of the year, will pay half the annual dues.

Article IX Elections

A nominating committee of three members will be chosen by the President at the April meeting. One member of the committee will be designated as chairman.

A slate of officers will be presented by the nominating committee at the May meeting. Nominations may be made from the floor, provided consent has been secured from the nominee.

Election of officers shall be held at the May meeting. Installation of new officers will take place at the June meeting. If any officer shall be unable to perform her duties because of death, resignation, or incapacity to act, her successor will be by a majority vote of the Executive Board.

Article X Committees

Committees will be appointed by the President as needed. Standing committees shall be reviewed annually. Suggested Committees are:

Article XI Executive Board
